"Engineering Consulting Services for Mead Raw Water Line Extension and Other Drinking Water WIIA Systems Improvements"

PROJECT OVERVIEW

The City of Plattsburgh seeks qualification-based proposals from New York State licensed professional engineering firms or licensed engineering teams to assist with engineering tasks associated with Drinking Water WIIA Systems Improvements (The Project).

The City has been awarded New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (NYSEFC) Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) grants for the Project. The proposed project consists of a variety of improvements aimed at providing water system upgrades including reliable source capacity, raw water transmission upgrades and Water Filtration Plant (WFP) upgrades.

The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) issued DEC Water Withdrawal Permit #5-0913-0036/00003 in April, 2023. Subsequently, public supply well PW-1 has been installed, and a second well, PW-2, is slated to be installed in 2025/2026. This project will consist of various work items associated with the funding with specific initial work to be the extension of a proposed new raw water main from its present proposed terminus near the intersection of Rand Hill Road and Route 374 to the West Plattsburgh Cross Connection on Rand Hill Road just south of Route 3. The raw line extension work will include:

- Complete permitting, design, bidding and construction administration services for extending the 16-inch raw water main from the north side of Route 374 to the West Plattsburgh Cross Connection on the south side of Route 3 which includes three existing water mains to be connected to.
- Obtain utility information including underground electric, telecommunications, and natural gas within the project corridor.

- Update a survey prepared by Aubertine & Currier in April & May 2024 to include underground utilities not previously identified.
- Working collaboratively with the City of Plattsburgh to determine the pipeline alignment considering the presence of existing utilities.
- Installation of geotechnical borings necessary for trenchless road crossings.
- Permitting with SHPO based on the Phase IA Archeological Investigation prepared by Landmark Archeology dated March 2025.
- Permitting with the Clinton County DOT and NYSDOT for work in road rights-of-way.
- Funding assistance with the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation including grant assistance and preparing disbursement requests.
- Developing an engineer's opinion of probable cost of construction.
- Submitting final plans and specifications to NYSDOH incorporating all funding agency program requirements for review and approval.
- Assisting with bidding services to select the lowest responsible contractor.
- Providing construction administration services.

The Project referenced in this RFQ is anticipated to be funded with New York State and/or Federal loan and grant funds. All project activities associated with the project must be performed in accordance with NYSEFC requirements and regulations.

In selecting the consultant engineering firm the City will consider the following qualifications:

- Qualifications of the firm
- Related project and general experience of team
- Experience of key project team members
- Familiarity with the City's water system
- Ability to meet schedules
- Working relationships

STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATION (SOQ) REQUIREMENTS:

The SOQ response shall include the following:

- 1. A description of your firm's experience and qualifications in providing design and construction phase engineering services for similar municipal drinking water projects;
- 2. An organizational chart specifically identifying the key members of the project team available to be assigned and committed to this project along with their experience on similar projects. The chart shall identify one primary point of contact;
- 3. Confirmation that the proposer is a professional engineer licensed to work in the State of New York; and
- 4. A list of successfully completed NYSEFC funded projects completed over the last four-year period.

A detailed scope of services and fees will be negotiated with the selected consultant after

selection. No scope of services is requested at this time, but interested consultants should demonstrate ability to complete proposed project and required services.

SUBMISSION OF INFORMATION

All SOQs must be received before 11:00 am on Thursday January 15, 2026. The envelope shall be labeled "Drinking Water Phase 4 SOQ". Please submit your SOQ hard copies only to:

EVALUATION

The SOQs will be reviewed and evaluated as outlined below.

First, the responsiveness of the SOQ will be determined. To be responsive, it must comply with the submission requirements.

A comparative assessment of the SOQs will be made after determining that all requirements of the RFQ have been satisfied.

Firms may be contacted for an interview. Once an engineering firm has been chosen, the City will negotiate a final scope of work and a corresponding price with that firm. If an agreement is not reached, the City will work its way down the list.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Proof of General Liability Insurance, Automobile Liability, Workers Compensation and NYS Disability Insurance will be required prior to commencing any work. Liability insurance coverage shall be in the amount of \$2,000,000, Combined Single Limit or equivalent. Professional liability insurance is required. Excess Liability coverage shall be in the amount of \$2,000,000. The City of Plattsburgh needs to be named as additionally insured.
- 2. Compliance in NYS Department of Labor (DOL) requirements for payment of prevailing wages to survey employees in accordance with the DOL Prevailing Wage Determination furnished for this project and on file in the Engineering Department, City Hall.
