






City of Plattsburgh Harborside Master Plan

Summary of Responses from the Community Survey, January 2022

The City of Plattsburgh is developing a Master Plan for its Harborside Lakefront and Riverfront subareas. In order to gather public input on the project, an online survey was available to the public from January 14 to January 25. During that time, 1,094 people took the survey. Participants were asked a total of 18 questions about their ideas, priorities, and concerns about the future of Plattsburgh's Harborside site. Survey questions were a combination of multiple-choice, ranking criteria, and some open-ended responses for issues or concerns not covered within the survey.

Community Survey Summary

- 1100 participants from January 14-25
 - 53% said they don't visit Harborside because there isn't enough to do
 - 53% access Harborside Lakefront via Dock Street, 22% via Green Street. 42% access the Riverfront Subarea via Durkee Street Ped Bridge
 - 65% favor active recreation as high priority at Lakefront
 - 54% favor whitewater recreation as high priority, another 32% as medium
 - 69% believe Harborside is lacking passive recreation
 - A popular open form comment was for Harborside to be appealing to people of all ages















An LED or water interactive that illustrates the water cycle A continuously moving cycle of evaporation, condensation, precipitation, evaporation, etc.












THE WATERSHED FLOW




